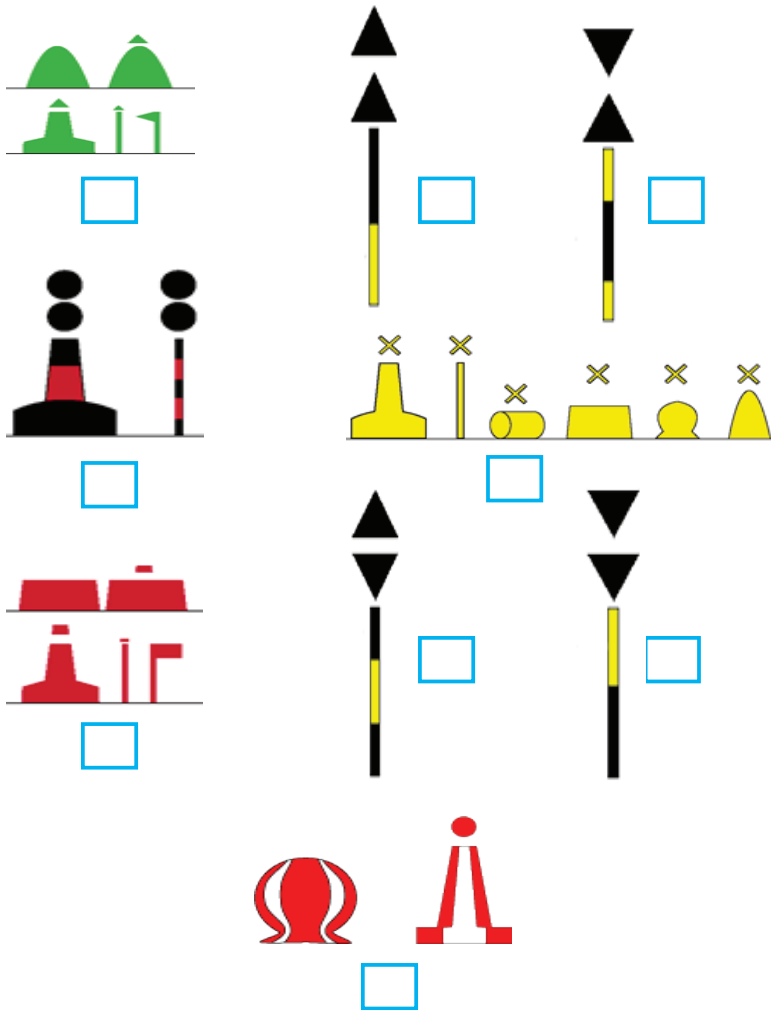


MARKER BUOYS

- Q3 What is the front of the boat called?
 Transom Bow
- Q4 What is the back of the boat called?
 Stern Bow
- Q5 Where would you find a Bollard?
 On the deck In the engine room
- Q6 Two boats are approaching each other head on, what do you do to prevent a collision? Alter your direction to:
 Port Starboard Stop boat
- Q7 When should an EPIRB be carried?
 When going more than 5 nautical miles from land
 When going more than 2 nautical miles from land
 When going more than 2 nautical miles from a marina
- Q8 What colour is a stern light?
 Red White
- Q9 What colour light does a Safe Water Mark display?
 Red White
- Q10 Does a Personal WaterCraft (PWC) rider need a special PWC Licence?

- Q11 What do you do when you are near swimmers?
 Slow down Stop the motor
- Q12 What must a skier be wearing?
 A wetsuit which has built-in buoyancy
 A PFD (lifejacket) Type 2 or 3
- Q13 What must a person know before skiing?
 The skiing signals and safety rules
 The person driving the boat
- Q14 In terms of speed, what is a knot?
 One knot is one nautical mile per hour
 1,000 metres
- Q15 How do you estimate if you are doing over 6 knots?
 Other boaties are waving at you
 Six knots is equal to a brisk walking pace
 You are passing other vessels

- Q16 Apart from sail boats, what other types of vessels do you give way to?
- Large vessels, trawlers, dredges, ferries
 - Coast Guard boats
 - Police boats
- Q17 You are coming from the ocean in to a river, which side do you pass the Starboard (green) lateral mark on?
- On your boat's Port (red) side
 - On your boat's Starboard (green) side
- Q18 On your way back out to the ocean, do you keep the Starboard markers on your boat's Starboard or Port side?
- Port
 - Starboard
- Q19 What is the requirement for registering a vessel?
- Any vessel capable of a speed in excess of 40 knots
 - Any vessel with a motor of over 4hp
- Q20 Where must the registration label be affixed?
- On the Port side of the hull next to the registration numbers
 - On the windshield
- Q21 Where must the registration numbers be affixed to the boat?
- On the Port side of the hull
 - On the Starboard side of the hull
 - On the Port and Starboard sides of the hull
- Q22 What do the following short whistle blasts indicate?
1. one short blast 2. two short blasts 3. three short blasts
- 1a turning to Starboard
 - 1b turning to Port
 - 2a turning to Port
 - 2b going astern
 - 3a going astern with motors
 - 3b I am entering marina
- Q23 What navigation lights are required on a powerboat less than 12 metres?
- Sidelights (Port - red), (Starboard - green), a white mast and stern light (or an all round white light instead of the mast and stern light)
 - White light at the top of the mast
- Q24 What navigation lights are required on a trawler?
- Green over white up the mast, plus a Port and Starboard light
 - An all round red light
- Q25 Which side of the channel do you drive?
- Left (Port) side
 - Right (Starboard) side
- Q26 A sail boat is crossing your Bow from Port to Starboard, what do you do?
- Give way
 - Stand on
