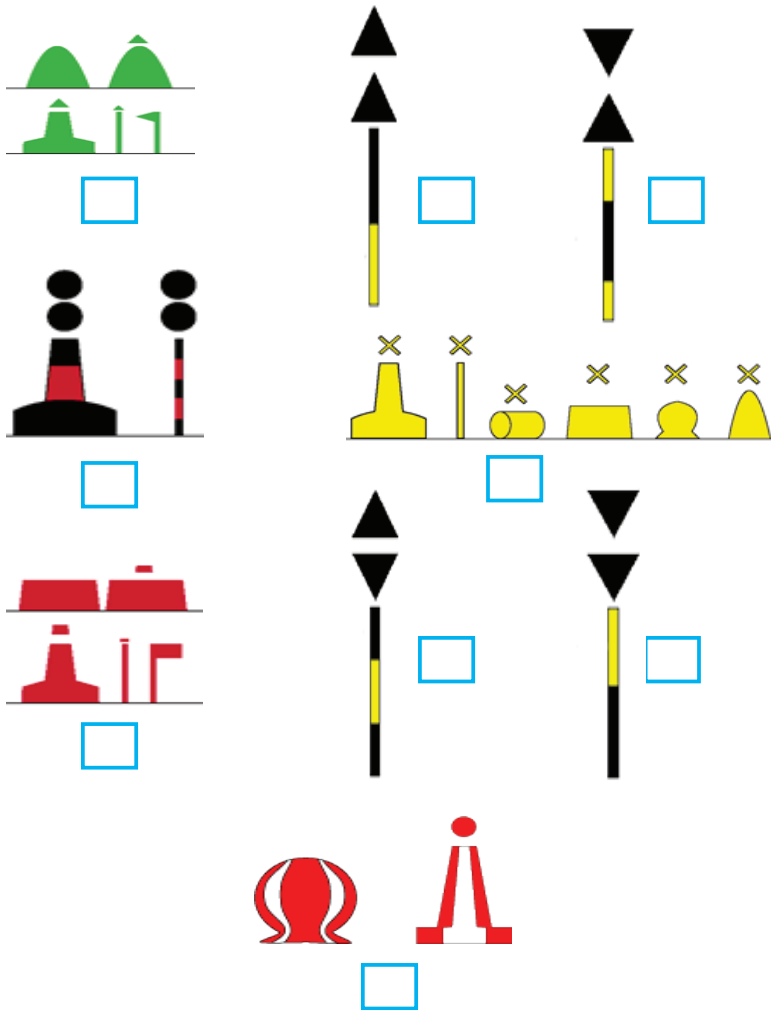


## MARKER BUOYS



ABOVE ARE A NUMBER OF NAVIGATION AIDS. THEIR NAMES ARE:

## PWCL (JETSKI LICENCE) PRE-ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS

- Q1 What is the maximum speed you are allowed to travel within 60 metres of a jetty?  
 4 knots and no wash       6 knots and no wash
- Q2 What is the maximum speed you are allowed to travel in smooth water limits?  
 10 knots       40 knots
- Q3 Do exceptions apply to 6 knots within 60 metres of shore?  
 Yes       No
- Q4 What is the exception?  
 When the waterway is less than 120 metres wide  
 There are no lateral markers
- Q5 Where is the best place to fuel your PWC?  
 On the land       In the water
- Q6 Two jetskis are approaching each other head on, what do you do to prevent a collision? Alter your direction to:  
 Port       Starboard       Stop boat
- Q7 When should an EPIRB be carried?  
 When going more than 5 nautical miles from land  
 When going more than 2 nautical miles from land  
 When going more than 2 nautical miles from a marina
- Q8 Do EPIRBs have an expiry date?  
 Yes       No
- Q9 Does a Personal Water Craft (PWC) have to carry navigation lights in restricted visibility?  
 Yes       No
- Q10 Does a Personal Water Craft (PWC) rider need a special PWC Licence?  
 Yes       No
- Q11 What do you do when you are near swimmers?  
 Slow down       Stop the motor
- Q12 What must a skier be wearing?  
 A wetsuit which has built-in buoyancy  
 A PFD (lifejacket) Type 2 or 3
- Q13 In terms of speed, what is a knot?  
 One knot is one nautical mile per hour  
 1,000 metres
- Q14 How do you estimate you are doing over 6 knots?  
 Other boaties are waving at you  
 Six knots is equal to a brisk walking pace  
 You are passing other vessels

## PWCL (JETSKI LICENCE) PRE-ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS *Cont'd*

- Q15 Apart from sail boats, what other types of vessels do you give way to?
- Large vessels, trawlers, dredges, ferries
  - Coast Guard boats
  - Police boats
- Q16 You are coming from the ocean in to a river, which side do you pass the Starboard (green) lateral mark on?
- On your Port (red) side
  - On your jetski's Starboard (green) side
- Q17 On your way back out to the ocean, do you keep the Starboard markers on your jetski's Starboard or Port side?
- Port
  - Starboard
- Q18 Registration symbols must be displayed on?
- Port side
  - Starboard side
  - Both sides
- Q19 Where must the registration label be affixed?
- On the Port side of the hull next to the registration numbers
  - On the windshield
- Q20 Where must the Ride Smart Sticker be affixed?
- Where it can be seen by other vessels
  - Where it can be seen by the operator
- Q21 What navigation lights are required on a Personal WaterCraft in restricted visibility?
- Sidelights (Port - red), (Starboard - green), a white stern light (or an all round white light)
  - White light only
- Q22 What navigation lights are required on a trawler?
- Green over white up the mast, plus a Port and Starboard light
  - An all round red light
- Q23 Which side of the channel do you drive?
- Left (Port) side
  - Right (Starboard) side
- Q24 A sail boat is crossing your Bow from Port to Starboard, what do you do?
- Give way
  - Stand on

## PWCL (JETSki LICENCE) PRE-ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS *Cont'd*

Q25 You are about to operate your PWC in an unfamiliar waterway. What would you do to familiarise yourself with the area?

- Ask a friend who knows the area
- Study a chart of the area

Q26 You have a passenger on your PWC. What are you going to get the passenger to do to make your journey safer?

- Get the passenger to carry a picnic lunch and drinks
- Get the passenger to keep a lookout for other craft and navigation aids

Q27 Your passenger has just fallen off your PWC and you cannot understand why. What should you do so that it does not happen again?

- Tell your passenger to hold on harder
- Don't turn so sharply in the future

Q28 What is the correct way to right your capsized PWC?

- As long as you right it, it does not matter how you do it
- Ask your PWC's manufacturer's agent

Q29 You have been invited by friends to operate your PWC from the beach in front of their house on a canal. Are you doing anything wrong?
